Eileen F. Baker, MD, FACEP (Incumbent Candidate)

Dr. Baker completed her residency in Emergency Medicine at Summa Health System in Akron, Ohio, in 2001. She practiced for seven years at Union Hospital, in Dover Ohio, where she also served as EMS Medical Director for six years. In 2008, Dr. Baker moved to Bowling Green, Ohio, to pursue a PhD in Philosophy, while continuing to work full-time at Wood County Hospital and Mercy Hospital, Defiance.

She has been active in Ohio ACEP since 2003. Dr. Baker was an Alternate Councillor in 2003, and a Councillor from 2004 to the present. She co-chaired the Ohio ACEP EMS Committee from 2006-7 and served as Secretary from July 2005-6, President-Elect from July 2006-7, and President from July 2007-9. At the National ACEP level, Dr. Baker has been a member of the Continuing Education Committee, EMS Committee, Reference Committee and Teller Committee. She was EMS Section Secretary from July 2007-8. At present, Dr. Baker is a member of the Ethics Committee.
